



Instructions - Year 3

Prior Knowledge:

- Use of commands as a sentence type
- Organising ideas using different headings

Key features

Headings and Sub-headings	An additional headline or title that comes immediately after a headline or a heading given to a paragraph or section of writing.
Introduction	The first paragraph of the text which gives basic information about what follows.
Technical Vocabulary	Words specific to the topic of the text.
Present Tense	Actions which are currently happening or usually performed.
Diagram	A simple plan that represents an idea or system, often used to explain how it works.
Labels	Gives information about specific parts of a diagram.

Purpose: A non-fiction text which explains how or why something works

Examples: Recipes, games, how to guides

Organisation, structure and effect

- Read and compare examples of instructional texts, evaluating their effectiveness.
- Identify the key features and organisational devices of an instructional text.
- Follow a set of instructions and evaluate their effectiveness.
- Write clear written instructions using correct range of features and devices to aid the reader
- Use clear headings and sub-headings
